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Biography

Kevin Judd was named the first NCAA men's volleyball head coach at Cal Lutheran in the fall of 2015. He led the Kingsmen to a National Championship in 2024. In 2019, the Kingsmen were ranked No. 12 nationally in the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) preseason poll and were moved up as high as No. 8. In the same year, the program got its first win against a top-10 team as they defeated No. 4 Stevens Institute of Technology 3-2. The Kingsmen garnered their first-ever AVCA National Player of the Week with outside hitter Patrick Rowe earning the award. Judd is also an assistant for the women's program and is in his 14th season. In the fall of 2015, he was named the AVCA Assistant Coach of the Year for his contribution to the Regals 2015 NCAA National Championship. Judd joined the women in 2006, primarily overseeing outside hitters and setters. Under his guidance, the Regals have produced 28 AVCA All-American selections, five SCIAC tournament championships, seven straight SCIAC Championships (2010-16), and four NCAA Regional Championships.
